The Patton College of Education at Ohio University invites applications for a full time Director position in liaison with the Department of Teacher's Education. The mission of the Literacy Center is to foster development activities, research aimed at solving problems of low-level literacy and language development, and cooperative projects with other University departments and communities through the region. The Center is expected to be self-sustaining through substantial grants. The successful candidate will oversee the work of the Literacy Center and manage its daily operations which include developing programs and partnerships with the region and the State of Ohio, entrepreneurial development by obtaining federal grants and major development of regional, state, federal and global opportunities. For administration, the candidate will supervise personnel, maintain the Center's budget and fiscal accountability, and manage projects related to research, professional development and services. The Director is expected to create a collaborative environment with faculty, staff and students in Ohio University and throughout the region, state, nation and globally through professional development, service, outreach and research. We seek a candidate who shows evidence of substantial grant acquisitions, a demonstrated commitment to literacy research, a strong record of leadership, and a vision to fulfill the mission of the of the Literacy Center. It is required to have the ability to multitask among:

- Grant securement and administration
- Program development including supervision of anticipated staff
- Supporting research of faculty and students.

Qualifications

Minimum: A master's degree is required along with one year in administrative and supervisory experience, with a minimum of three years' experience in literacy related fields. Evidence of substantial grant acquisitions and a demonstrated commitment to literacy research are required along with a vision to fulfill the mission of the Literacy Center.

Preferred: A doctoral degree in literacy, educational studies, higher education, or related fields.
