

# Clinical Assistant Professor in Secondary Humanities Education

The Department of Instruction & Teacher Education at the University of South Carolina's College of Education seeks a full time (10.5 month) Clinical Assistant Professor in Secondary Humanities Education to begin January 3, 2017. The ideal candidate should demonstrate a commitment to excellence in Secondary Humanities (Social Studies and/or English) Education. Experience working with diverse populations, expertise with educational uses of technology, and experience with school-university partnerships are preferred.

**Responsibilities**The successful candidate will join a team of faculty and be expected to: (1) teach general education courses within the Secondary Education program, (2) teach Social Studies and/or English courses in the M.T. and M.A.T. program, (3) teach general education courses in the Online M.Ed. program; (4) advise MT and MAT students in secondary Social Studies and/or English programs, (5) supervise MT and MAT students in secondary Social Studies and/or English programs during clinical experiences, (6) develop and teach a Humanities track of courses for the M.Ed. degree programs; and (7) collaborate with Secondary Social Studies and/or English coordinators on accreditation activities.

**Qualifications**Applicants must have: (1) an earned doctoral degree in Secondary Social Studies, English, or related field in the humanities conferred before December 2016; (2) at least three years of secondary teaching experience in Social Studies, English or related humanities field; (3) an ability to teach general education and/or social studies and/or English methods courses within the M.T. and M.A.T. Secondary Education and/or M.Ed. online program; (4) a demonstrated commitment to instructional methods that support diversity, inclusiveness, and academic achievement; (5) experience supervising teacher candidates during their clinical field experiences; (6) experience working with diverse populations; and (7) an ability to incorporate innovative pedagogies and technologies in their teaching.

Review of completed applications will begin October 31, 2016 and continue until the position is filled.
